



AUDIT OF VALUES

CURRICULUM

Crofton Core Values, SMSC and FBV are explicitly taught across all year groups and in all subject areas. Pupils are taught how to work well together, how to listen actively and how to appropriately present their views. Obviously some subjects lend themselves more readily to specific topics within this work. In July 2018 all departments were asked to highlight where they explicitly teach Core Values, SMSC and FBV and here are a few examples from the audits that we have in school:

English: Dr Jekyll and Mr Hyde – appreciation of the duality of man and moral codes in Victorian times. Analysis of how language can be used to imply things and manipulate people. Looking at how our choices affect others. Analysis of what it means to be respectable and how this links to responsibility.

Maths: Y7 board game project - Communication & collaboration through teamwork and presentations. Consideration of needs of others and pride in work.

MFL : Rights and responsibilities - Daily routine in UK compared to a Third World Country. Discussion about what is important to different people in different countries, and the importance of charity/environment. Also discussion about how individual liberties differ between countries.

ICT: E-safety - Personal freedom, responsibility and accountability. Considering respect for self and others. Analysis of what makes effective communication.

History: Weimer and Nazi Germany – analysis and learning about: democracy; rule of law; tolerance; cultural diversity; conflict and propaganda

- Positive, assertive discipline behaviour policy: reward system linked to this. Pupils are given responsibility (e.g. use of phones etc.)
- Staff open their classrooms to pupils at lunchtime: informal promotion of respectful interaction
