Settling In

- Examine the consequences of smoking.

- Find out about the aims and activities of a range of charities.
- Produce a promotional presentation to be shown in assembly.

Careers

- Introduce Careers Education and Guidance at Crofton Academy. Strengthen prior knowledge and understanding of the world of work. Explore pupils' aspirations and plans for the future.

Environment and Leisure

- Identify ways our planet is damaged. Consider the effects of litter and vandalism.
- Investigate leisure opportunities in the Wakefield District.

YEAR 8

SEAL

- Developing self-awareness and empathy with others. Consider factors which encourage motivation. Be able to manage strong feelings and enhance social skills, especially communication.

Personal Safety

- Consider risks to personal safety through issues of cyber bullying, including mobile phone theft and chat rooms.
- Design safety tips for young people.

Drugs and Alcohol

- Know the risks and effects of a range of drugs.
- Find out about drugs legislation and develop coping strategies.

Healthy Living

- To encourage a positive self-image, through healthy eating and exercise.
- Discover how to perform emergency aid in the case of an accident.

Relationships

- Consider the importance of families and other relationships, including both love and conflict. Investigate the types of pressure put on young people.
- Reflect upon the conception and birth of a baby.

Industry Day/Finance

- Take part in a range of enterprising workshops to find out how different functions of a business work together to achieve success. Find out about bank accounts at different financial institutions.

YEAR 9

Prejudice and Stereotype

- Understand the different types of prejudice and discrimination that can exist in the world today.
- To investigate gang culture and the consequences of gun and knife crime.

Love and Responsibility (Frozen timetable day)

- Investigate sexual activity and the importance of relationships.
- Consider pressures put on young people.
- Discuss risks and agencies for advice.

Fair Trade

- Consider how people in underdeveloped countries make a living.
- Develop understanding and empathy for people in underdeveloped countries.

Sexual Health
